

Exploring Siem Reap

Siem Reap is famous for being the gateway to the UNESCO world heritage site of Angkor Wat. Brimming with archaeological history, a visit to the park is a must, however there are so many options. We offer two main Temple Tour packages to cater for our guests' needs.

PLEASE NOTE - Entrance tickets to the Angkor Wat Archaeological Park have to be purchased separately by visitors with passport identification at the gate of the park (you will notice that many tour operators don't mention this detail, giving the impression that the tour price covers all costs).

Your driver will take you to the ticket office so you can purchase your pass (they aren't allowed to buy it for you). The ticket office takes cash and credit card. There is also an ATM at the ticket office in case you need it, and the office is open from 4:30am - 5:30pm. One-day tickets can only be bought for the day of purchase (unless you buy after 5pm which will allow you to enter the following day).

There is an option of buying a pass online, however sometimes the system can be unreliable in busy seasons. The official site for online tickets is <https://ticket.angkorenterprise.gov.kh/auth/login?returnUrl=%2Fpurchases>

There are 3 types of passes available:

- 1-day pass – US\$ 37;
- 3-day pass – US\$ 62;
- 7-day pass – US\$ 72;

The 3-day pass is valid for 10 days from the issue date, the 7-day pass is valid for 1 month from the issue date. So with both of these passes it's not necessary to plan your visits on consecutive days.

The entrance fee includes a US\$ 2 contribution to the Kantha Bopha Children's Hospital fund.

There are plenty of cafes scattered throughout the park providing both local and western cuisine options for lunch.
